Technology-Enhanced Learning (TEL) Committee AMEE E-Poster Prize, 2019 Author Information

Background

E-posters are rapidly becoming a valuable mode of information delivery at academic conferences. AMEE has been one of the innovators in having e-posters at its annual conferences. From 2019, AMEE is introducing an e-poster prize.

Eligibility for the Prize

To be eligible for the prize:

- The e-poster must have been created for the AMEE2019 Conference or the TEL2019 Symposium.
- At least one author listed on the poster must be registered and physically present at the AMEE2019 Conference and/or the TEL2019 Symposium.

Aim

The aim of the prize is to select examples of good practice in preparing e-posters, especially demonstrating how the technology adds value to the e-poster.

Judging

Members of the TEL Committee who have submitted e-posters may not be among the judges. Judging of the e-posters will proceed as follows:

- From 1 August 2019, judges from the TEL Committee will begin accessing the e-posters online. This means that, if you are aiming for the prize, you need to have your e-poster as complete as possible by 1 August 2019. (You may make changes after that date, but those changes might not be taken into account by the judges.)
- Each judge will independently draw up a short list of 10 posters based on the stipulated criteria.
- Before or during the conference, the judges will meet, and will reach a consensus of the top five posters.
- In the event of uncertainty, judges may attend the presentations in order to assist in their final decisions.
- At the end of the presentations, the judges will meet again. Based upon the final score, the winner will be established.
- The winner will be announced at the AMEE2019 final plenary session.

Prize

The winner will receive one free AMEE Conference registration, or a cash prize of £350.

E-Poster design

It is crucial to note that a good e-poster is not simply a paper poster in pdf format, and authors should ensure that their e-poster demonstrates the value of the technology. As a guideline, authors are encouraged to:

- Read <u>How to make an effective e-poster</u>. (Note: This is a generic guide to e-poster design, and not all items will be applicable to the e-poster software currently used by AMEE);
